MOVEMENT OF PET ANIMALS TO HUNGARY (/hun)

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I. NON-COMMERCIAL MOVEMENT

Non-commercial movement means movement of 'pet animals' which are accompanying their owners or a natural person responsible for such animals on behalf of the owner during their movement and are not intended to be sold or transferred to another owner. Requirements according to the Regulation 998/2003/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on the non-commercial movement of pet animals, as amended (hereinafter REGULATION)

1.) Identification

Pet animals shall be regarded as identified where they bear: (a) either a clearly readable tattoo; or (b) an electronic identification system (transponder). In the case referred to in point (b), where the transponder does not comply with ISO Standard 11784 or Annex A to ISO Standard 11785, the owner or the natural person responsible for the pet animal on behalf of the owner must provide the means necessary for reading the transponder at the time of any inspection.

2.) Anti-rabies vaccination

At the time of movement, when the pet animal come from a third country and enter to Hungary, pet animals shall be accompanied by a veterinary certificate, issued by a veterinarian authorised by the competent authority, certifying valid anti-rabies vaccination, or revaccination if applicable, in accordance with the recommendations of the manufacturing laboratory, carried out on the animal in question with an inactivated vaccine of at least one antigenic unit per dose (WHO standard).

3.) Blood test

If the pet animal is coming from, or through a third country not listed in part A, B, or_C of Annex II to REGULATION, and enter to Hungary, a neutralising antibody titration at least equal to 0,5 IU/ ml carried out in an approved laboratory, on a sample taken by an authorised veterinarian at least 30 days after vaccination and

three months before being moved. This three-month period shall not apply to the re-entry of a pet animal whose passport certifies that the blood test was carried out, with a positive result, before the animal left the territory of the Community. In Hungary the neutralising antibody titration can be carried out in

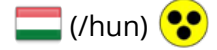

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4.) Passport or certification

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Pet animals coming from an EU member state, listed in part A or part B section 1 A, or B, section 1 of Annex II to the REGULATION or coming from a third country listed in part B section 2 of Annex II to the REGULATION, must be accompanied a pet passport, issued by an authorized veterinarian. Pet animals coming from a third country not listed in part B section 2 of Annex II to the REGULATION, must be accompanied by a certificate issued by an official veterinarian or, on re-entry, by a passport certifying compliance with the provisions above.

5.) Quarantine

Where checks at the entry point reveal that the animal does not meet the requirements above, the competent authorities shall decide: (a) to return the animal to its country of origin; (b) to isolate the animal under official control (quarantine) for the time necessary for it to meet the health, identification or documentation requirements, at the expense of the owner or the natural person responsible for it; or (c) as a last resort, to put the animal down, without financial compensation, where its return or isolation in quarantine cannot be envisaged.

II. COMMERCIAL MOVEMENT OF DOGS, CATS AND FERRETS

Commercial movement means movement of more than five animals not accompanied by the owner of the animals, or a person responsible for the load.

Directive 92/65/EEC which lays down the requirements governing trade and imports as regards animal health, was amended by Regulation 998/2003, which ensures the uniformity of the rules applicable to trade and non-commercial movements of animals. The identification, anti-rabies vaccination and blood test (if applicable) requirements are the same, than in case of non-commercial movement.

The animals should be accompanied by a veterinary certificate for domestic dogs, cats and ferrets entering the European community for commercial movements both in English and Hungarian.

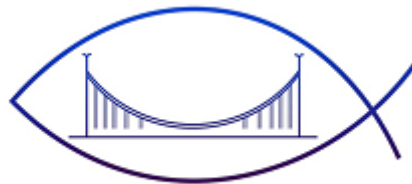

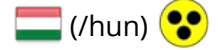

MÓVIMIENTO DE ANIMALES DE COMPAÑÍA A HUNGRÍA

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I. MOVIMIENTO NO COMERCIAL

Movimiento no comercial significa el movimiento de "animales de compañía" que acompañan a sus dueños o una persona física responsable de tales animales en nombre del propietario durante su movimiento y no están destinados a ser vendidos o transferidos a otro propietario. Requisitos según el Reglamento 998/2003 / CE del Parlamento Europeo y del Consejo sobre el movimiento no comercial de animales de compañía, en su versión modificada (en adelante REGLAMENTO)



1.) Identificación

Los animales de compañía se considerarán identificados cuando lleven: (a) un tatuaje claramente legible; o (b) un sistema de identificación electrónica (transpondedor). En el caso mencionado en la letra (b), donde el transpondedor no cumple con la Norma ISO 11784 o el Anexo A de la Norma ISO 11785, el propietario o la persona física responsable del animal doméstico en nombre del propietario debe proporcionar los medios necesarios. Para leer el transpondedor en el momento de cualquier inspección.

2.) Vacunación contra la rabia.

En el momento del traslado, cuando el animal doméstico venga de un tercer país y ingrese a Hungría, los animales de compañía deberán ir acompañados de un certificado veterinario, expedido por un veterinario autorizado por la autoridad competente, que certifique la vacunación válida contra la rabia o la revacunación si aplicable, de acuerdo con las recomendaciones del laboratorio de fabricación, realizado en el animal en cuestión con una vacuna inactivada de al menos una unidad antigénica por dosis (norma de la OMS).

3.) Prueba de sangre

Si el animal doméstico proviene de, o a través de un tercer país que no se encuentra en la parte A, B o C del Anexo II del REGLAMENTO, y ingresa a Hungría, se realizará una titulación de anticuerpos neutralizantes al menos igual a 0,5 UI / ml realizada en un laboratorio aprobado, en una muestra tomada por un veterinario autorizado al menos 30 días después de la vacunación y tres meses antes de ser trasladado. Este período de tres meses no se aplicará a la reentrada de un animal de compañía cuyo pasaporte certifique que el análisis de sangre se realizó, con un resultado positivo, antes de que el animal abandonara el territorio de la  (/hun)  Comunidad. En Hungría, la titulación de anticuerpos neutralizantes se puede llevar a cabo en

Animales de compañía procedentes de un estado miembro de la UE, enumerados en la parte A o parte B, sección 1 A o B, sección 1 del Anexo II del REGLAMENTO o provenientes de un tercer país enumerado en la Parte B, sección 2 del Anexo II del REGLAMENTO, Debe ir acompañado de un pasaporte para mascotas, emitido por un veterinario autorizado. Los animales de compañía procedentes de un tercer país que no figuran en la parte B, sección 2, del anexo II del REGLAMENTO, deben ir acompañados de un certificado expedido por un veterinario oficial o, al reingresar, por un pasaporte que certifique el cumplimiento de las disposiciones anteriores.

5.) cuarentena

Cuando los controles en el punto de entrada revelen que el animal no cumple con los requisitos anteriores, las autoridades competentes deberán decidir: (a) devolver al animal a su país de origen; (b) aislar al animal bajo control oficial (cuarentena) por el tiempo necesario para que cumpla con los requisitos de salud, identificación o documentación, a expensas del propietario o la persona física responsable del mismo; o (c) como último recurso, dejar al animal, sin compensación económica, cuando no se pueda prever su devolución o aislamiento en cuarentena.

II. MOVIMIENTO COMERCIAL DE PERROS, GATOS Y FERRETS

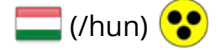
Movimiento comercial significa el movimiento de más de cinco animales no acompañados por el propietario de los animales, o una persona responsable de la carga.

La Directiva 92/65 / CEE, que establece los requisitos que regulan el comercio y las importaciones en materia de sanidad animal, fue modificada por el Reglamento 998/2003, que garantiza la uniformidad de las normas aplicables a los intercambios

comerciales y no comerciales de animales. Los requisitos de identificación, vacunación antirrábica y análisis de sangre (si corresponde) son los mismos que en el caso de movimientos no comerciales.

Los animales deben ir acompañados de un certificado veterinario para perros, gatos y hurones domésticos que entren en la comunidad europea para movimientos comerciales tanto en inglés como en húngaro.

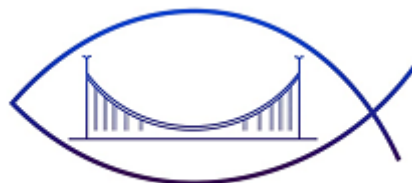

Explanatory notes for completing the animal health certificates

- (a) Where the certificate states that certain statements shall be kept as appropriate, statements which are not relevant may be crossed out and initialled and stamped by the official veterinarian, or completely deleted from the certificate.

- (b) The original of each certificate shall consist of a single sheet of paper, or, where more text is required it must be in such a form that all sheets of paper required are part of an integrated whole and indivisible.

- (c) The certificate shall be drawn up in at least one of the official languages of the Member State of entry and in English. It shall be completed in block letters in at least one of the official languages of the Member State of entry or in English.

- (d) If additional sheets of paper or supporting documents are attached to the certificate, those sheets of paper or document shall also be considered as forming part of the original of the certificate by the application of the signature and stamp of the official veterinarian, on each of the pages.

- (e) When the certificate, including additional sheets referred to in point (d), comprises more than one page, each page shall be numbered (page number of total number of pages) at the end of the page and shall bear at the top of each page the certificate reference number that has been designated by the competent authority.

- (f) The original of the certificate shall be issued by an official veterinarian of the territory or third country of dispatch or by an authorised veterinarian and subsequently endorsed by the competent authority of the territory or third country of dispatch. The competent authority of the territory or third country of dispatch shall ensure that rules and principles of certification equivalent to those laid down in Directive 96/93/EC are followed.

The colour of the signature shall be different from that of the printing. This requirement also applies to stamps other than those embossed or water-marked.

- (g) The certificate reference number referred to in Boxes I.2 and II.a shall be issued by the competent authority of the territory or third country of dispatch.
